Webinar on Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) - Its Prominence in the Industrial Setup

November 30, 2021

Attended by: Mr D. Chandra Sekhar, Director, IEDS; Mr Gulshan Singh Bist, Asst. Director; Ms N Sumathi, Asst. Director MSME-Development Institute, Hyderabad; Speakers from Vakeelspot Technologies; Mr R Prakash, Chairman, IEEMA Southern Region and Mr Jesse A Inaparthi, State Head (AP & TS), IEEMA.

Key points discussed:

- MSME Director Spoke on MSME grants for IPR process (once any MSME gets successful patent, they are eligible for the reimbursement (for Domestic Patent it will be Rs. 1 Lakh and Foreign Patent Rs. 5 Lakhs).
- Further to Director's speech, he encouraged, if IEEMA is interested and can give a proposal on establishing Common Facility Centre (bringing Sophisticated Equipment, Design Development, R&D, Testing Set up under CFC), under MSECDP scheme, the grant will be given upto 90% of the total project cost (up to 20 Cr).
- 360° view on IPR and its importance in the industrial set up.
- Special focus was on Pre-Packaged Insolvency Resolution Process (PPIRP) for MSMEs.

Outcome: Webinar was well received by the participants.

Webinar on Global Market Access - A module on Transformers

Key points discussed:

Key points discussed:

 Ms Charu Mathur, DG, IEEMA welcomed all members to the meeting. She urged them to strengthen the membership base by giving new references, reaching out to non-utility based stakeholders for exploring new business opportunities E3 presents the right opportunity.

- State of Industry presentation was given by Chairman. The members discussed about the steep prices of metals and alloys which is affecting the commodity prices all over the globe.

Key points discussed:

- Mr Guruprasad was requested for reduction of BG. He has agreed and circular for supplies would be released soon.
- The topic for enhancement of type testing period was discussed. MD agreed on this & has assured that they would get it passed in the next board meeting.
- Payment issue was raised and Mr Guruprasad assured that payment to the best extent possible would be made.
- Training programme for UPPTCL staff was discussed, Mr Guruprasad has asked for a proposal. He also requested IEEMA to put up routine maintenance procedure of equipment on the website so that instead of a select few everyone can benefit.
- MD UPPTCL also asked the industry to find ways for remote monitoring and control of equipment.

Drafting Committee Meeting with CEA on Cyber Security Regulation 2021

December 6, 2021

Attended by: The meeting was chaired by Shri MAKP Singh, Chief Engineer(IT), Central Electricity Authority; Representatives from NCIIPC, Power Grid, NHPC, NTPC, IIT Kanpur and IEEMA members & officials.

Key points discussed:

- CEA mentioned that the document presented on 6th December 2021 is a breathing document and prepared using single perspective. Many perspectives are yet to be added.
- Under clause Application Security and Testing in 17.4, comments / suggestions were sought from IEEMA.
- FAQ will be prepared and this document would be available in public domain for suggestion.
- MoP has not designated any patches for Surrogate Test-Bed. A new point was included that is "All applications/ websites must pass through Security Audit before hosting on Internet"

Actions taken:

The key discussion points and R-6 version of the CEA Cyber Security Regulation was forwarded to Energy Meter, Smart Grid, Technical Committee and SPOC leaders for inviting comments.

Outcome:

CEA requested for suggestion/comments on the various clauses of the regulation document.

Meeting with Core Group Members of Energy Meter Division regarding the exclusions of Smart Meters from the Make in India Public Procurement Order

December 7, 2021

Attended by: IEEMA members & officials

Key points discussed in bullet format:

- Member discussed to put the argument an represent the matter first to Joint Secretary, Distribution, Shri Vishal Kapoor, Ministry of Power;
- IEEMA was suggested to seek appointment from DPIIT, MEITY and NITI Aayog

Actions taken:

Appointment was sought from MEITY and DPIIT along with Ministry of Power.

Outcome:

Representation to Joint Secretary, Ministry of Power was submitted regarding Industry concerns on exclusion of Smart Meters from the MII Public Procurement Order.

Meeting with Shri Vishal Kapoor, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Power on exclusion of Smart Meters from the Make in India Public Procurement Order

December 9, 2021

Attended by: The meeting was chaired by Shri Vishal Kapoor, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Power; IEEMA members & officials

Key points discussed:

- IEEMA mentioned that copies of CA certificate duly collected from few leading Smart Meter Manufacturers confirming their Minimum Local Content above 50% was presented.
- Industry gave assurance to Ministry of Power that 5 to 6 players are themselves able to supply to 5 to 6 Crores of Smart Meters.
- Mr Kapoor mentioned that there are supply issues in J&K, Bihar and Rajasthan.
- Members also informed that PFC Consulting Ltd. has issued Global Open Competitive bidding which is discouraging to local manufacturers
- IEEMA mentioned that removing Smart Meters from the "Make in India" Order will potential discourage Investments being made by component manufacturers of Relays and LCDs who are trying to set up their base in India.

Action taken:

Information regarding Global Competitive bidding floated by PFC Consulting ltd. for UT of Puducherry is being submitted to MoP.

Outcome:

MoP gave an assurance that they shall review the submission made by IEEMA and take appropriate action.

14th edition of T&D Conclave concluded successfully in the presence of 250 senior officials from 150 plus Organisations held at Hotel Shangrila, New Delhi.


This is the first IEEMA physical program post COVID and received wonderful feedback from all the stakeholders.
